The candidate appointed will require the following:

- A professional mental health qualification e.g. RMN (Registered Mental Nurse), OT (Occupational Therapist), CQSW (Certification of Qualification in Social Work) or equivalent clinical supervision qualification
- Experience of managing a mental health caseload
- Empathetic and person-centred approach to meet the needs of those who are vulnerable
- Experience of working within the statutory NHS/Social Care or voluntary sector
- An understanding and aptitude for leading and managing a vibrant mixed team of volunteers and staff and its value to individuals and communities
- Knowledge and experience of partnership work with statutory agencies, voluntary and independent sectors
- Team player who can provide clear leadership, support, supervision, encouragement and direction to volunteers and staff
- Good organisational skills to include excellent IT, telephone and the ability to prioritise their own workload and that of their team
- A "can-do" and creative approach to developing the role and our services
- An understanding of the challenges facing the farming and horticultural community in Lincolnshire
- Full clean driving licence
- Home based
